All participants must have*:

- 1.) *Eye and ear protection & hat or ball cap. *STRONGLY RECOMMENDED:* Walker Razor Slim Electronic Muffs, \$36.89 Amazon
- 2.) *Blouse or shirt that's close fitting around neck. Helps keep hot brass out.
- 3.) *Range bag or hard case (with firearm inside). Please mark the muzzle direction on top of your case (arrow) so that you know the direction of the muzzle and know it is always pointing down range or in a safe direction.
- 4.) If you're bringing your own firearm, bring at least 500 rounds of ammo for the handgun you'll be shooting most often.
- 5.) 2-4 Magazines. Speed loader for revolvers if you have them.
- 6.) If you have an outside the waist band holster & appropriate belt, please bring them. As well as magazine pouches. *NO CANVAS, one-size-fits-all!!*
- 7.) *Folding chair
- 8.) Check the weather and dress appropriately. Layers recommended.
- 9.)*Notebook and Pen/pencil
